COURSE TITLE: Selected Topics: Bank Risk Management

DESCRIPTION OF COURSE: This survey course first explores financial institutions then examines the various risk factors faced by financial institutions. Several techniques for quantifying risk factors are discussed, followed by an overview of approaches to managing such risks.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: Through this course, you will (1) strengthen your knowledge of how financial institutions operate; (2) be exposed to various principles, problems, practices, regulations, and analysis associated with financial institution capital, asset, liability, and liquidity management; and (3) become familiar with financial decision-making skills in the area of credit, portfolio, liquidity, and operational risk management.

COURSE DESIGN: The course will utilize lectures, class discussion, problem analysis, research, and web-based assignments delivered via SHSU Online (Blackboard).

RESEARCH/DATA ACTIVITIES: The research section will involve completing activities associated with scholarly articles and utilizing external data. There will be at least one research/data activity for each of the three sections of the course.

ASSIGNMENTS: The assignments will involve longer, mainly quantitative, problem sets similar to the problems found in the textbook and reviewed in the PowerPoint slides and videos. There will be 8 – 10 assignments throughout the semester, with each assignment worth 10 – 15 points.

EXAMS: Exams will be primarily analytical problems along with qualitative discussion, multiple-choice, true-false, and matching questions. There will be three exams; approximate exam due dates and coverage are as follows:
