Course Layout:	<p>I will assign homework problems, but will not grade them. Instead, I will be giving short, weekly homework quizzes based on the homework problems assigned. The two lowest homework quizzes will be dropped.</p> <p>There will be four exams, including the final. If you have good attendance you will be able to replace the lowest exam score with your final exam.</p> <p>Do all the assigned homework, and take notes. You should aim to get an ‘A’ on the weekly quiz; this is how you will know if you are studying enough or if you need to seek my help.</p>

Classroom Rules: Study well, ask for help when you need, and do what you know is right.

Classroom Goals: Develop confidence in your ability to approach and overcome problems.

University Policy: *Use of phones:* The use by students of electronic devices that perform the function of a telephone or text messenger during class-time are prohibited except with prior approval from the instructor for emergency use. Even the visible presence of such a device during the test period will result in a zero for that test.
