I will use the notification tool on the Connect4Education site, rather than Blackboard, for class announcements. Likewise, the schedule of classes is found on this site; though you may work at your own pace, I strongly encourage you to keep up with the assignments so you complete the first half of them before the midterm & the second half before you take the final. Falling behind will likely affect your performance on the heavily-weighted mid-term and final exams. Classes and the final exam are set to close at 10pm on December 7, 2017. Per SHSU, this is the latest we can go, down to the wire. There are no extensions. Along those lines, there is no extra credit in this class. Ask for help before you muddle through earning a grade you don't want.

The text for the course is presented as a series of online lessons followed by quizzes. Therefore, you will not be purchasing a physical textbook, but an access code to the course. To begin:

- 1. Go to http://www.connect4education.org.
- 2. Select the Online Store tab at the top.
- 3. In the store page, select OnMusic Fundamentals.
- 4. Add it to your cart and purchase it (\$99.95).
- 5. You now have an access code; to register, select Registration Tab at top of home page.

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- 6. The tab takes you to http://www.register.connect4education.com.
- 7. Using your access code, complete the required form.
