DESCRIPTION OF COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

This on-line class is a deadline and quality oriented course. Each and every assignment <u>must be submitted by the posted deadline</u>, and graduate quality work is expected of all students. Late submissions will not be accepted.

SYLLABUS SIGNATURE:

A syllabus policy acknowledgment signature is required from you to indicate that you have read the policies and contents of the syllabus and agree to abide by the policies of the university and the course. The syllabus acknowledgment signature must be submitted by its due date for the 5-point bonus. If it's submitted late, but submitted before the last class date of the semester, 0 points will awarded. Units:

There are four units in this course. Please complete the quizzes, exams, and abstracts as listed in each unit by the unit due dates.

ABSTRACTS:

One journal article abstract assignment will be included with each unit. The article should address the general drug or drug issue being covered in the current unit. Articles should come from professional (academic) journals (2010 or later). Please check with the library if you do not understand what constitutes an academic journal. The abstracts should be one typed page and should be referenced in <u>APA style</u> (http://www.shsu.edu/centers/academic-success-center/writing/handouts.html.). No quotes should be used in this assignment. All ideas should be paraphrased, rather than quoted. A visit to the University Writing Center at http://www.shsu.edu/centers/academic-success-center/writing/index.html may be helpful. Summarize the content of the article and provide a personal reaction/ critique/perspective. A sample abstract is attached on Blackboard under the sample abstract tab. Late submission is not allowed.

EXAMS:

Four exams will be administered. The exams will be objective (primarily multiple choice and true false) and will cover the following chapters:

Exam One Chapters 1-5
Exam Two Chapters 6-8
Exam Three Chapters 9-12
Exam Four Chapters 13-18

The best way to study for the exams is by reviewing the reading assignments, chapter quizzes, and power point lectures. Exams must be completed in the designated time frames found in the course calendar. Exams **will not reopen** after the exam period has ended. If you start the exam on time, but finish after the period closes, a **penalty of 1 point deduction per minute** late submission will be assessed. Please pay close attention to the exam periods. Exams consist of 50 objective items. There is a one hour time limit on exams. You are allowed only 1 attempt for the exams. However, a second attempt is allowed **ONLY** if you encounter technical difficulty. I will check each attempt to verify the reason for the second attempt, and **I reserve sole discretion** in determining whether the second attempt is justified.

QUIZZES:

Each student will complete ten quizzes covering the material from the text. Quizzes are located under the corresponding unit in Blackboard – under the Course Content folder. Each quiz is worth ten points. Quizzes must be completed by the deadline listed on the calendar. Pay close attention to the open and close dates of each quiz. Once a quiz closes, it will not reopen for any reason, so do not ask. To avoid problems related to quiz completion (including technical problems) do not procrastinate the completion of quizzes until the last minute. If a problem does arise, you must notify me no later than five days before the close date for those quizzes. You may have your book and power points available when taking the quizzes. You are allowed an unlimited number of attempts for each quiz, with the highest grade recorded in the Blackboard grade book.

There should be no mistake concerning what is required in this course. If you have any questions or problems at any time, do not hesitate to contact me. I am glad you are in my class.

Plagiarism and other assignment need-to-knows:

- □ If an assignment seems unclear, it is *YOUR* responsibility to talk to the instructor early.
- If you desire academic accommodation for a documented disability, please see the section on Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ASAP.
- Plagiarism is a big word that simply means using someone else's work or writing without giving credit. If you copy a paragraph, sentence or even phrase from someone else's work, you must place quotes around what you have copied and cite the author. If you borrow an idea from someone else, but don't quote them exactly, you don't need to add the quotes, but you still must cite the author. When citing an author, use either the APA style (Brown, 2014) or the AMA style (superscript number¹) immediately after the statement. Then, in the Endnotes give the entire reference: 1. Brown, S (2014). Best article. Journal of Cool Stuff; 4(2), p.3-7. This is your warning; if you borrow without giving credit you will get zero points for the parts borrowed. If you are working on an assignment that requires all your own work (or an exam), you should not be citing other authors anyway.

STUDENT ABSENCES ON RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS POLICY

Section 51.911(b) of the Texas Education Code requires that an institution of higher education excuse a student from attending classes or other required activities, including examinations, for the observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that purpose. A student whose absence is excused under this subsection may not be penalized for that absence and shall be allowed to take an examination or complete an assignment from which the student is excused within a reasonable time after the absence.

University policy 861001 provides the procedures to be followed by the student and instructor.
