Course Description:

This course is an undergraduate introduction to ballet course for non-majors to introduce the theory and practice of ballet. Classes will include ballet steps, positions, and exercises for the barre and center. No previous experience in dance is required.

Course Objectives:

The objectives of this course are to:

- Introduce basic ballet steps
- Develop foundational alignment and placement for ballet
- Learn basic ballet vocabulary
- Become familiar with basic ballet etiquette and form
- Enhance physical fitness and kinesthetic awareness
- Enhance appreciation of ballet as an art form through

Course Policies:

Department Attendance Policy – Due to the participatory nature of the course, attendance is mandatory. Attendance will be taken each and every class period. Each absence in excess of three class periods will lower the student's course grade by 5 points. No make-up classes will be allowed. Absences for official university functions may be excused provided that the student requests this accommodation before the absence occurs and presents official documentation. Professional opportunities will be assessed at half an absence. All other absences count toward the total of three.

There is a strict **no tardy** policy. Tardy students may not be allowed into class and could receive an absence for the day.

In cases of minor injury or illness, students may be allowed to observe rather than participate physically. In such cases the student must request the accommodation before class begins and present observation notes to the instructor at the conclusion of class. Students with ongoing medical or physical problems must develop a program of recovery in consultation with a physician/physiotherapist and with the instructor. If the condition interferes with the student's ability to participate for an extended period, he or she will be advised to drop the course.

Class Dress Code:

Girls – Leotard (solid color), Tights (solid color, pink preferred), Ballet shoes (pink preferred), and hair in a bun (or if it is too short secured back from the face as best as possible). Ladies have the option of wearing a skirt (solid color preferred).

Boys – Solid color form-fitting shirt; solid color tights, biker shorts, or form fitting leggings (black preferred); ballet shoes (preferably with socks of the same color)

• Class Etiquette – Interruptions of the class including talking, sitting down, stopping in the middle of a combination, arriving late to class, leaving the classroom without permission, etc. are distracting and disrespectful each other. With the exception of injuries or emergencies please ask for permission before being excused from the dance studio. Proper hygiene is strongly encouraged. Cell phones and other electronic devices are to be left in the dressing rooms and not brought into the classroom. No food, chewing gum, or drinks other than bottled water are allowed in the dance studio.

Class Assignments/Responsibilities:

- Movement Evaluations: Students will perform a mid-term and final movement combination consisting of basic ballet steps and combinations.
- Journal Assignments: Students will write two journal assignments as a way to set goals, self-assess and evaluate their own progress, and reflect upon their movement evaluations.
- Vocabulary Quizzes: Students will take two ballet vocabulary quizzes covering some basic ballet terminology.
- Ballet Observation: Students will watch and/or discus a sampling of a classical ballet and complete a written assignment on their observations.
- Non-Majors Workshop: At the end of the semester all students will perform in Non-Majors Workshop a piece of choreography learned in class. Non-Majors Workshop is **December 4**, **2017** at 7:00 pm, call time is 6:00 pm. This will serve as the final movement evaluation for this course.

STUDENT ABSENCES ON RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS POLICY:

Section 51.911(b) of the Texas Education Code requires that an institution of higher education excuse a student from attending classes or other required activities, including examinations, for the observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that purpose. Section 51.911 (a) (2) defines a religious holy day as: "a holy day observed by a religion whose places of worship are exempt from property taxation under Section 11.20...." A student whose absence is excused under this subsection may not be penalized for that

absence and shall be allowed to take an examination or complete an assignment from which the student is excused within a reasonable time after the absence.

University policy 861001 provides the procedures to be followed by the student and instructor. A student desiring to absent himself/herself from a scheduled class in order to observe (a) religious holy day(s) shall present to each instructor involved a written statement concerning the religious holy day(s). The instructor will complete a form notifying the student of a reasonable timeframe in which the missed assignments and/or examinations are to be completed.
