Course Description:

This course satisfies the updated Texas Success Initiative mandate. The state has revised the law and now mandates that departments provide several options to address the varying degrees of student needs, in order to strengthen targeted weaknesses in a more efficient manner, thereby expediting the students' transition into college-level courses. This tutorial is taken in conjunction with MATH 1314. This course will allow the enrolled students to attempt their college-level math course while it provides the necessary support to help improve the students' chances for success. This course is required for students who have not met readiness standards for math.

This is a Pass/Fail Course:

- Students who complete the coursework successfully by the end of the semester will receive a 'CR' (pass) and will be TSI compliant.
- Students who do not successfully complete the coursework and who do not pass their college level math class with a C or better will receive an 'NC' (fail).
- Credit in this course will not be allowed to count toward graduation or computation of grade point average (GPA) or classification of students by hours completed. (Course does not fulfill University degree requirements.)
- A student can at any time pay and retake the TSI exam. If you pass with a 350 or higher we will give you credit (CR) for the course. This course may not be dropped.

Attendance Policy: Attendance is mandatory and taken at the beginning of class daily by swiping in at the workshop. Students are expected to attend the workshop for a least 2 hours per week. Should an emergency arise (such as a serious illness or death in the family) please report your absences through the Dean of Students. His office will assist you in gathering the required documentation and make sure that all your professors are made aware of the circumstances. The instructor will decide whether the documented circumstances qualify as an emergency or not. The Dean of Students office is located in Suite 215 of the Lowman Student Center.
