<u>Course description</u>: This course is concerned with the principles and methods used in managing and operating organizations. Course coverage includes analysis of the organization's environment and the four basic managerial activities. The class will consist of lecture and class discussion. Students are expected to read assignments before class so that meaningful discussions in class can take place. Students are encouraged to share examples from their own experiences that relate to class material.

Course Objectives:

1.The major objectives of this course are for students include gaining an understanding of the fundamental principles and concepts of management.

- 2. Examine the management environment.
- 3. Learning the tasks of the manager.
- 4. Students should develop a basic understanding of managing.
- 5. Study the elements of the functions of management.

<u>Exams</u>: Four (4) exams will be administered, three exams during the semester and one (1) final exam. Exams will consist of objective questions such as multiple choice. All exams are worth 100 points each. <u>There will be no makeup exams</u>. Please don't miss exam day. <u>If exam day is missed, student must take the comprehensive final exam (which consists of 18 chapters)</u>. <u>Only one (1) exam can be missed, any more and you will receive a zero.</u> The comprehensive final (1-18) will count for one two grades, the exam missed and the final.

<u>Course Grades</u>: Grades in this course are determined by applying the following scale to a student's average. There will be 3 exams and 1 final (100 points each) covering material from textbook, lectures & class discussion and any assigned supplemental reading. When and if assignments are given, they must be turned in on the day due, in class, not by email, delivered to my office or brought to class by another student, unless otherwise instructed by instructor.

Attendance:

Regular attendance is expected and will be taken daily. Attendance is also used to evaluate borderline cases in determining final grades. The University allows for 3 hrs, or 2-1 1\2 hr classes for the maximum days missed. In this class, this means you could miss one week of classes, if ill, or have emergencies in your family. Any additional days missed will be left to the discretion of the instructor as to when or if an additional point for borderline cases will be added to final grade. Due to recent happenings, any classes missed after 5, five, there will be a grade deduction of 5 points for each day absence after 5 days. This means absence 6, there will be five points deducted from the student's grade. Students are expected to arrive at class on time, and not get up to leave in the middle of class. This will result in being marked as absent. Extra credit and in-class assignments will be done IN CLASS, hence the in-class assignment, unless otherwise directions given by instructor. Student must be in class in order to qualify for the receiving the extra credit/assignments points.

STUDENT ABSENCES ON RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS POLICY

Section 51.911(b) of the Texas Education Code requires that an institution of higher education excuse a student from attending classes or other required activities, including examinations, for the observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that purpose. A student whose absence is excused under this subsection may not be penalized for that absence and shall be allowed to take an examination or complete an assignment from which the student is excused within a reasonable time after the absence.
