# **Course Description**

This course focuses on the planning, implementation, and control of projects. Coverage will include the ten knowledge areas and lifecycle of projects. The appropriate intellectual foundation will be established so that students can work, individually and in teams to solve project related problems. Prerequisites: MGMT 3380 and BANA 3363. Credit 3. (SHSU Undergraduate Catalog).

Students are expected to read, take notes, participate in activities and discussions, and complete all course requirements.
