Course Description: The nonprofit sector of society is referred to as the "third sector", with government and business as the first two sectors. In this course we describe and analyze the role of the "third sector" in politics, policy making, and policy implementation. In the first section of the course, we will discuss the characteristics of nonprofit organizations, their place in society, and their evolution. In the second section of the course we will discuss the relationship between governments and nonprofit organizations. In the third section we will analyze nonprofits' roles in the policy making process. In the fourth section of the course we will discuss their impact on politics and policy making.

Course Objectives:

-building a knowledge base regarding the role and influence of nonprofit organizations in politics and policy making

-learning fundamental principles, theories, approaches that advance our understanding of nonprofit organizations in politics and policy making

-developing skills useful for professionals in nonprofit organizations

Course Readings:

All course reading and viewing materials will be posted on Blackboard. These will include scholarly journal articles, news reports, websites, government documents, videos, interviews, as well as other sources. There is no textbook to buy.

Course Assignments:

- -Discussion Boards: Students are required to participate in discussion boards 3 times during the semester. This entails first posting your answer and then responding to others' post as directed in the assignment. Each is worth 3.3% of the course grade.
- -Weekly Reading Quizzes: For each of 15 weeks you will have a Readings Quiz. It will consist of 10-20 multiple choice questions. You will have 2 hours to complete the quiz.

The quiz grade average will be calculated using the 13 highest of your quiz grades. Each of these is worth 3.1% of the course grade. .

- -Skill Development Project: The goal of this project is to develop a skill that is useful for working in a nonprofit. It could include an activity such as training, volunteering, or writing a policy brief on a relevant issue. I must approve your proposed skill development project. The details of the project are posted on Blackboard. This is worth 20% of the course grade.
- -Nonprofit Politics Research Project: The goal of this project is to analyze the political activities of NP organizations. You will write a paper about 2 nonprofits engaging in political activity on the same policy issue. The details of the project are posted on Blackboard. This is worth 30% of the course grade.
