Develop understanding of:

- a) Principles of wind, percussion and string instruments.
- b) History of the instruments
- c) Pedagogy of beginning instruments
- d) Unique characteristics of each instrument

### **Enrollment:**

The course is designed for students in the Bachelor of Music, Teacher Certification (vocal emphasis) Track. Prerequisites: none. Credit 1

### **Class Participation:**

The nature of the course requires participation from and interaction among all class members.

#### Attendance:

A significant portion of the class is dependent upon reading assignments and classroom discussion, and we will have guest performers to demonstrate various instruments. Consequently, absence or tardiness will influence the student's final grade. Recognizing that there are legitimate reasons to miss a class, an absence may be excused for grading purposes by permission of the professor. All requests for an excused absence will be made in writing at least two (2) weeks prior to the absence. Emergencies will be considered on a case by case basis. No work related absences will be excused.

Please leave all cell phones and PDAs turned off during class sessions. If a student is in an emergency situation and needs to have the cell phone turned on, please inform the instructor prior to the beginning of class.

#### **Grade Scale:**

- Discussion postings and assignments submitted through Blackboard will represent 20% of the final grade.
- Quizzes over classroom discussions and presentations will comprise 50% of the final grade.
- A research paper on an aspect of wind, string or percussion instrument pedagogy will comprise 20% of the final grade. The topic to be studied and a minimum of five sources of reference material should be submitted via Blackboard for approval by the instructor on or before midterm. The presentations of the research projects will take place during the last two weeks of classes.
- The final exam will represent 10% of the final grade.
