Functional keyboard realization of jazz harmony with typical idiomatic voicings. Emphasis on developing the ability to perform chord progressions to enhance jazz arranging, teaching and jazz improvisation.

- Execute each skill with no hesitation at a minimum tempo with correct notes
- Be able to thoroughly learn and competently perform chord progressions of jazz standards and other jazz repertoire
- Assume individual responsibility for progress by passing each skill in succession
