Course Syllabus GEOG 4359 Transportation Geography

Course Description:

Transportation geography is an important branch of geography. It is mainly concerned with the movement of goods, people, and information as well as the constraints and attributes of all the spatial interactions between places. From day to day commute to international trade, movements of people, goods and information have always been fundamental components of human societies. Contemporary economic processes have been accompanied by a significant increase in mobility and higher levels of accessibility.

This course introduces students the basic concepts, theories, and methods of transportation geography. It covers topics like transportation infrastructure, modes and terminals, transportation and economy and trade, urban transportation, logistics, and transportation planning. In addition, this course also covers various analytical techniques applied in transportation analysis such as network analysis, gravity model, location-allocation modeling, and geographic information system in transportation.
