



ORAL ACTIVITIES (25% total): These activities include both graded presentations and ungraded pronunciation practice. The presentation must be uploaded on the date indicated. For the role-play, you will work with a classmate and upload your recording. The oral interview will take place over the phone during finals week – you will receive a Doodle link after Spring Break to sign up for an interview time. Oral grades are based on pronunciation/fluency, organization, vocabulary, and grammar.

WRITING ACTIVITIES (15%): Writing activities consist of informal and formal assignments. See individual tasks on Blackboard and Connect for more information.

<u>CULTURE ACTIVITIES (15%)</u>: Culture activities will be assigned in Connect (Cultura and Salu2) with additional individual activities assigned on Blackboard. In the Blackboard assignments, you will be asked to find examples of culture that appeal to you to share with the class (*Culturablog*); you will respond to your classmates' examples. More will be on the Blackboard assignment page.

MCGRAW-HILL GRAMMAR/VOCABULARY ACTIVITIES (20%):

LearnSmart 4% - LearnSmart is an adaptive tutorial that you should complete at least once, though you can complete each module as many times as you like. Think of these as flashcards. They will be available to help you study for unit progress checks and exams.

Grammar Review 2% - Grammar review assignments will ensure that you are fully prepared to use your grammar from previous semesters.

Connect 14% - Connect activities should be accessed through Blackboard in order to sync your progress and save the grades. You will receive the points earned on your BEST attempt (out of three possible attempts) for that activity. **IMPORTANT: Assignments are set to deduct 20% for each day after the due date.** You MUST get in touch with the instructor with a valid, **documented excuse for any extensions.**

<u>UNIT PROGRESS CHECKS (10%)</u>: During each unit, you will complete a check on your progress in learning and using Spanish vocabulary and grammar. This will be completed in Connect.

MIDTERM EXAM (7.5%) AND FINAL EXAM (7.5%) will cover the following:

- 1. LISTENING COMPREHENSION (dictation, oral questions, oral passage, true/false, other)
- 2. VOCABULARY (fill in, definitions, identifications, other)
- 3. GRAMMAR (fill in, translation, other)
- 4. READING COMPREHENSION (questions, true/false, other)
- 5. WRITING (essay, short answer, other)
- 6. CULTURE (true/false, multiple choice, other)

Exams are to be completed on Connect on the date indicated. You must have a well-documented excuse to make up an exam.


DEADLINES AND EXTRA CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES:
