<u>Course Description</u>: A course designed to explore the source of impulse. To encourage the student to remove their mind from their work and act on the instincts and impulses found within their entire body. This course will also server as an introduction to safe and effective stage combat and how it relates to scene work.

<u>Course Objective</u>: To stretch the artist to use his/her body in new ways and to explore new avenues for creating work. To explore the open process of Viewpoints and how it relates to scene work and the structured process of Stage Combat.

<u>Classroom Attire</u>: Please wear comfortable, non-restrictive clothing, preferably dance or yoga attire. Form fitting is always better. We will be bending and stretching in all directions. Skirts and JEANS are a BAD IDEA. Footwear: For Viewpoints we will be BAREFOOT. For Stage Combat we will be in tennis shoes/sneakers. Please remove all jewelry. Keep hair pulled back off of your face. **A water bottle is always smart**. Please eat before class, but NOT DURING. No food please.

<u>Classroom Demeanor</u>: This is NOT a lecture class. We learn by doing. Come to class focused and ready to move, interact, discuss, and perform. You will be asked to work alone as well as with others. NO CELL PHONES, TABLETS, OR COMPUTERS IN CLASS. If you are caught texting or the like in class, your grade will be reduced. Please don't. No Classroom Visitors.

If a cellphone rings, dings, etc. during class, EVERYONE does 20 push-ups. SILENCE YOUR PHONES! If my phone goes off, I do 20 push-ups.

The classroom is a space in which many ideas and opinions are expressed and discussed. I ask that all students show respect, sensitivity, and discretion with each other and the topics that may be discussed in the classroom.

<u>Attendance Policy:</u> I do take roll. Everyone gets one free absence. Use it wisely. Tardiness is unacceptable and disrespectful to both me and your fellow classmates. I start on time, don't be late. Excessive tardiness will result in a reduction of your final grade. (See Participation)

Participation (600 pts, 25pts per class, 25 class days): The only way to learn is to be present and active in class. I do take roll and attendance/class participation are HUGE PARTS OF YOUR FINAL GRADE. However, showing up won't cut it. You will need to take an active role in the class exercises. If you show up on time, ready to work in the proper attire, and give 100% to your classmates, the work, and myself, you will get 25 points. Points will be lost for:

- 1. Tardiness: 5 min or less Minus 5 point
 - 5 min or more Minus 10 points
 - 10 min or more Minus 25 points
- 2. Not actively participating and/or contributing to discussions and exercises: Minus 15 points
- 3. Texting or the like during class: Minus 15 points
- 4. Inappropriate footwear or attire that limits your movement: Minus 10 point

Viewpoints (200pts): You will be performing various exercises associated with Viewpoints. You will be graded on your comprehension and application of these exercises as they are performed in class. Excessive tardiness will lower this grade.

Stage Combat (75pts): You will learn various elements of basic unarmed stage combat including but not limited to: slaps, punches, kicks, hair pulls, knaps, etc. You will be graded on your comprehension and application of these elements as they are learned in class both for safety and execution.

Stage Combat Scene Work (125pts): You will be assigned a scene partner and together you will create a scene that involves violence. You will work on the scene both inside and outside of class. You will apply stage combat principles/chorography taught by your instructor to the violence within the scene. You will be graded on your partnering and safety and will present your scene to the class.

A Note about Scene Work

Part of your grade will be based on partner work. You must be available to work with a partner in the rehearsal process, both in the classroom and outside the classroom. If you are unavailable to work with your partner, your grade will be lowered. Please make an effort to meet and rehearse your scene. You will be thankful you did. If you do not show up on the day when your scene is due to go up, you will be given an automatic ZERO for your scene. Your partner will not be penalized. Scenes are presented to the class and then reworked. Your grade is based on both the initial and the reworked performance.
