****Only** excused absences such as military obligations, religious holy days and representation of the university will classify as excused absences and will give you the opportunity to receive the points. Proper documentation must be shown for these absences.

Arriving on time for class and remaining in class until the end of the class period shows respect for your instructor, your fellow classmates, and/or any guest speakers. Because of its importance, you will not be allowed more than 2 tardies for the semester. Each time after 2 tardies you will be counted absent and not allowed to attend class. A tardy will be given for the first 2 offenses if it is less than 5 minutes after class has started. If you are more than 5 minutes late to any class, you will not be allowed to attend.

Attendance and Make-up Policies:

STUDENT ABSENCES ON RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS POLICY Section 51.911(b) of the Texas Education Code requires that an institution of higher education excuse a student from attending classes or other required activities, including examinations, for the observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that purpose. A student whose absence is excused under this subsection may not be penalized for that absence and shall be allowed to take an examination or complete an assignment from which the student is excused within a reasonable time after the absence.

University policy 861001 provides the procedures to be followed by the student and instructor. A student desiring to absent himself/herself from a scheduled class in order to observe (a) religious holy day(s) shall present to each instructor involved a written statement concerning the religious holy day(s). This request must be made in the first fifteen days of the semester or the first seven days of a summer session in which the absence(s) will occur. The instructor will complete a form notifying the student of a reasonable timeframe in which the missed assignments and/or examinations are to be completed.

Plagiarism:
