

ART 3305 – PAINTING I

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JANUARY 17 – MAY 10, 2018 / MW 12:00–2:50PM / 3:00–5:50PM

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course introduces students to basic concepts and techniques of painting as a means of visual communication. The class will cover issues of color, texture, figure / ground relationships, visual and spatial concepts and material concerns of paint handling and application, as well as introduce students to basic painting vocabulary and examples of historical and contemporary painting. Oil painting techniques will be explored using a range of source material, some of which will be student initiated. The course will include demonstration and both individual and group critiques.

ATTENDANCE:

Punctuality and attendance are mandatory. THREE UNEXCUSED absences will cause the attendance portion of your grade to be dropped one full letter grade. Continuing to be absent will cause your grade to drop as the course continues. Excused absences are those that involve a university approved religious holiday, health problems (with doctor's note), family or personal tragedy, or something officially unavoidable AND provable.

SCHEDULE / BREAKS:

Class begins promptly at 12pm (or 3pm). Please arrive on time and prepared to work in the media scheduled for that day. Be courteous to your peers and avoid tardiness. Arriving 30 minutes after class has started will be noted and habitual late arrivals will result in an absence.

GRADING:

Students will be assigned painting projects throughout the course of the semester. Homework complimenting the projects will also be assigned and is designed to assist in learning new concepts and ideas regarding painting. The homework is required and contributes to student's overall project grades.

Grades will be determined by:

- 1) The student's fulfillment of the specific goals of each painting and preparatory homework for the assignment.
- 2) Technical development, creativity, presentation, timeliness and effort. Grades for painting projects will be averaged together to account for 50% of the semester grade. The other 50% will be determined by attendance to class and critique participation. Not finishing a painting assignment, that is due for critique, nor attending critique will result in an F on said painting project.

CLASSROOM POLICIES:

Cell Phone use is NOT ALLOWED in class. No food in class. Coffee and other beverages should be in covered containers or

bottles. Full participation (this means active discussion) in our group critiques is essential. Class critiques will be scheduled for the beginning of class as noted in the syllabus, as the projects are assigned. Weekly homework will be assigned should be kept in a sketchbook journal.

All surfaces that receive oil paint must be primed with gesso first, including canvas, bed sheet, fabric, wood, etc.*

SURFACES

- ☐ Three 18x24" Canvas boards or stretched canvases for first three projects
- ☐ One oversized sheet of matte board sized at 22x30" – for Project One. Also called illustration board. This board will need to be gessoed, or primed before being painted on with oil paint.

BRUSHES

Turpenoid (like turpentine but does not smell)

Old, long sleeve shirt and paint pants

Drawing pencils, erasers

Sketch book (9x12)
