Math Works! \$50,432. A Developmental Education Summer Bridge Program was fully-funded as an academically intensive five-week program targeting recent high school graduates who did not have college entry-level math skills. The unique program design combined traditional instruction, workforce applications, and supplemental instruction while employing a reading-enhanced math curriculum.

Stark Foundation, 2006

These grant established a partnership with the National Emergency Medical Services Academy, 2007-2009. Funding in the amount of \$175,000 was requested and granted to the college to help defray the expenses associated with delivering paramedic instruction through a two-way interactive system and clinical affiliations.
