Ask your high school to send an official high school transcript with GPA, date of (expected) graduation, and graduation plan to Sam Houston State University. (*Code: 003606*)

Optional submit your test scores

If you choose to send your test scores, contact the appropriate testing agency to request submission to SHSU. (SAT school code 6643; ACT school code 4162)

Requirements

Eligible applicants should graduate high school with one of the following diploma types: Foundations with Endorsement(s)* or Distinguished Level of Achievement.

Automatic Acceptance **

Automatic acceptance for top 10% regardless of high school GPA, ACT, or SAT score.

* The endorsement earned must be noted on the transcript provided. Foundations only diploma type will be reviewed through holistic review. ** GPA based on a 4.0 scale.

Funding Your Journey Financial Aid and Scholarships

A variety of financial aid resources are available to assist with funding your education. Federal, state, school, and private funds are available to those who qualify.

- Grants: gift aid that does not have to be repaid.
- **Scholarships:** need-based or merit-based gifts that do not have to be repaid. While not all scholarships require a FAFSA on file, it is recommended you complete one.
- Loans: borrowed money that must be repaid with interest.

You must be accepted to SHSU to apply for SHSU scholarships. You must complete the general application in the *Scholarships4Kats* portal to review your scholarship eligibility. You are automatically considered for all relevant scholarships after you complete your profile.

Smith-Hutson Scholarship smith-hutson.shsu.edu | 936.294.3116

Students awarded Smith-Hutson Scholarships may receive financial support up to a maximum of \$19,500 per academic year for up to four years for incoming freshmen (Texas residents only) and two years for transfer students. Smith-Hutson Scholars also benefit from tutorial support, academic advising, mentoring, and professional development advising.
