<u>THEA 1364 Beginning Acting</u>: A study of basic techniques in body and voice as they are applied to the performance of an actor. We explore the craft of acting through vocal and physical warm-ups, ensemble improvisation, character analysis, and imagination work. We explore generosity on stage, learning to listen to a scene partner, as well as finding the joy in performance. Students work on three scenes over the course of a semester, along with accompanying research and analysis.

THEA 3373 Stage Movement for Actors: A course designed to stretch the artist to use his/her body in new ways and to explore new avenues for creating work. The students explore the open process of Viewpoints and how it relates to scene work. This course helps relieve the actor of the pressure to invent by oneself. The students learn to trust in letting something occur on stage, thereby finding the source for action and invention, which comes from us, others, and from the physical world around us.

THEA 3365 Stage and Theater Management: The students should gain an understanding of the basic process of stage management. We look at the stage managers procedures for pre-production, rehearsal, technical rehearsal, and the performance phases of the theatrical process. We also cover the professional world of Stage Management within the guidelines of Actors' Equity Association versus the educational non-professional environment.

<u>THEA 4331 Acting for the Camera:</u> A course designed to explore the skills and tools necessary for on-camera auditioning and acting work. This class is a practical, hands on approach to learning this medium. Using monologues and scene work, immersion in the process is the primary focus of the course. It is NOT a lecture class

on film or history of film; although viewing of videos will be utilized to examine both acting and directing technique.

<u>THEA 4326 Stage Combat:</u> Effectively use the body in hand to hand combat techniques. Employ a variety of conditioning and centering exercises as they relate to the discipline. Master the skills identified as the basics of unarmed stage combat by the Society of American Fight Directors. Master the skills identified as the basics of rapier and dagger combat by the Society of American Fight Directors(SAFD). Competently tell a story on stage through the use of stage violence.

<u>THEA 3369 Advanced Acting: Modern:</u> Explore the skills and tools necessary for advanced scene work using principles of phycological theatre. We will be utilize the plays of Anton Chekhov, primarily Uncle Vanya, Three Sisters, The Seagull, and The Cherry Orchard; however, there will be others added to the list to show counterpoint to the work of Chekhov. The student is led through various exercises exploring internal acting, event, and evaluation. These activities are designed to lead to the understanding of advanced concepts and techniques as they apply to the acting process. Studying the finer points of circumstances, action, and listening will allow the students to explore specific and strong creative choices in scene and monologue work. Also, the students will be introduced to the impact Chekhov has had on the modern theatre.

<u>THEA 3114 Acting/Directing Workshop:</u> Course is designed to be a supplemental course for Acting/Directing emphases. Some of the subjects it will cover will be, but not limited to: building a monologue repertoire, audition protocol, website design, researching trends in American Theatre and playwrights, including Pulitzer Prize winning finalists, cold reading, audition reader techniques, guest artist, etc.

<u>THEA 3372 Improvisational Techniques:</u> This course is designed to develop students' use of improvisations, games, and ritual to enhance creative thinking, problem solving skills, characterization, and trust within the rehearsal process.

<u>THEA 3374 The Actor and Commedia dell'Arte:</u> This course trains actors using stock characters of commedia dell'arte, an Italian theatrical form. Specialized in-class exercises, exploration of mask work and clowning lead students to find an awareness of their own habits in characterizations. Students broaden their physical expressiveness leading to a heightened and vibrant stage presence.

<u>THEA 2336 Voice 1 for the Actor</u> This course is an examination of how to improve the ability to communicate through more effective use of the voice. This will be achieved through exploring the basic processes of voice, speech, movement and acting and how they can be further integrated and unified for the performer.
