In both sections of the course more than 10 students enrolled in class. In fall 2021 except one student who received a "C" all were successful in completing the class.

In spring 2022 all students completed the assignments successfully.

In 2019-2020 academic year (with new graduate catalog) this course BESL 6315 has become part of the required courses for students who started in fall 2019.

Since then we offer this course twice a year, every fall and spring semester. Our enrollment numbers have been steady with 8-10 each semester.

Both semesters students completed their action research project successfully. The class is going very well as planned.

#### **Criterion Description:**

Candidates must achieve a score of 87 percent as measured by the textbook evaluation assignment. Program faculty determined that 87 percent represented our operational definition of success at learning.

#### **Findings Description:**

BESL 5313: ESL and EFL Methodology has been offered in fall 2021 as well as summer 2022.

In fall 2021 more than 12 students were enrolled in class and in summer 2022 7 students were enrolled in class.

90% received a score above 87% in analyzing a sample textbook for teaching English, exceeding the 87% criterion.

During summer 2022 one student was part of The Second Language Instruction Certificate. This student completed this assignment receiving 100%

This assignment was completed by students enrolled in BESL 5313 successfully. No new action plan at this point as this assignment has always received positive feedback from students.

Candidates must achieve a score of 87 percent of the teaching behaviors as evaluated by the teaching evaluation rubric. Program faculty determined that 87 percent represented our operational definition of success at learning.

#### **Findings Description:**

This "teaching observation" assignment was required in fall 2021 and students have successfully completed this assessment.

However, due to lack classes to be observed during summer, this assignment was not included in the syllabus of summer 2022 syllabus.

**RELATED ITEM LEVEL 3** 

#### Language Instruction Action Description:

In fall 2021, one sections of BESL 5313 was offered. IWe had 18 students who were enrolled in the course. In summer 2022 another section was offered. There were a total of 7 students enrolled in the course in summer 2, 2022 session. Of the 48 students they all received over 90% in the classroom observation assignment, exceeding the 90% criterion.

The Second Language Instruction Certificate students (5% of class, 1 student named Steve Synder) completed the exceeded the determined criterion successfully.

BESL 5302: *Social, Cultural and Language Influences* course has been offered both in fall 2021 as well as in spring 2022.

In both sections of the course more than 10 students were enrolled in class. In fall 2021 except one student all students were successful in completing this assignment.

In spring 2022 all of the students completed this particular assignment successfully.

BESL 5311: Applied Linguistics course has been offered both in fall 2021 as well as spring 2022.

In both sections of the course more than 10 students enrolled in class.

90% received a score above 87% in analyzing sample of English Language Learners, exceeding the 87% criterion.

Our recruitment efforts will continue. We will be involved in more proactive recruitment efforts. We did not utilize social media in 2020-2021 we hope to in 2021-2022 academic year.

#### Update of Progress to the Previous Cycle's PCI:

We offered BESL 6335: ESL/EFL Practicum course once again in spring 2022 and unfortunately, we did not have enough students who would want to take it. We already cancelled it twice before.

We offered a new STEM course in spring 2022 and 6 students enrolled in it. We plan to offer it again.

Our recruitment efforts will continue. Unfortunately, our numbers are down compared to previous years. We believe post-COVID-19 impact has a lot to do with it. In the meantime, we hope to be more involved in more proactive recruitment efforts.

Lastly, TESOL program has completed its self-review in fall Spring 2018. We just got notified on September 1, 2022 that we are up for a review again in 2022-2023 academic year.
