Because the certificate is comprised of approximately half of the coursework required for the MS in Security Studies, most students in the program are those who are in the MS program and declare the certificate in their final term, making enrollment tracking challenging.

Successful completion of assignments from required coursework has been identified as a direct method of assessment in place of prior IDEAS survey scores.
