



Purpose:

Historically, Hispanic and African American men have lower retention and graduations rates in both Texas and the United States. The most recent 6-year graduation rates from the Digest of Education Statistics show the deficit in the area of educating minority men. National graduation rates for African American males are an abysmal 35.2%, and graduation rates for Hispanic males are 47.7%.

To counter this, in 2000, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) approved the *Closing the Gaps: The Texas Higher Education Plan* in order to increase minority retention and graduation rates in higher education institutions. In support of *Closing the Gaps*, Sam Houston State University (SHSU) established the Sam Houston Establishing Leadership In and Through Education (SH ELITE) Program in


