

Alpha Lambda Delta, also known as ALD, is an honor society that recognizes first year college students. The ALD chapter at Sam Houston State University is a program for students who maintain a GPA of 3.5 or higher during their first semester of college; the first semester of college at any university, not only SHSU. Invitations to join are sent out in December to students eligible for membership by maintaining the 3.5+ GPA requirement during his or her first semester of college.

Once a member, students are required to attend meetings every other week on Wednesdays from 5:00-6:00 pm. The ALD chapter of Sam Houston has recently started up an annual movie night during the fall semester. This year's movie night will show The Blind Side on Thursday, November 30th at 6:00 pm. The movie will be shown in the LSC Theater next to the Kat Klub. In the weeks preceding the annual movie night, ALD hosts a raffle with prizes given out during movie night. Prizes can include, but are not limited to, lottery trees, scantrons, Fitbit, and much more. The students who enter into the raffle need not be present at movie night to receive their prize.
