# **Goal Description:**

Through the medium of comprehensive examinations, Spanish language MA students will demonstrate that they have a graduate-level breadth of knowledge in literature, language, linguistics and methodology.

# Performance on American Council of Teachers of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) Oral Proficiency (OPI)

#### **Indicator Description:**

Students must take the computerized version of OPI upon completion of the MA program and show highly advanced oral production skills.

# **Criterion Description:**

Students will achieve the rank of "superior" oral production skills as per the OPI computerized test.

#### **Findings Description:**

The department did not have a necessary budget to cover the cost of administering the OPI computerized version at the MA level.

Consequently, WOLC is currently working to see how this cost can be offset by the college and/or students in 2017-2018.

# Written And Oral Comprehensive Exams

#### **Indicator Description:**

In their last semester, Spanish language students will demonstrate that they have a graduate-level breadth of knowledge in 1.linguistics and methodology, 2. Spanish literature and 3. Spanish American literature, as well language useage through written and oral comprehensive exams.

This has been done on the basis of required course content that each individual student has taken and grading according to the individual professor (individual rubrics).

# **Criterion Description:**

All MA in Spanish candidates for graduation will achieve pass or high pass on written and oral comprehensive exams during their last semester in residence. These exams cover the three content areas, Linguistics & Methodology, Spanish Literature and Spanish American Literature. The Department will direct particular attention to evaluation of the exam preparation and performance among on-line students. **Findings Description:** 

Four MA graduates successfully passed (with a grade of pass or high pass) the written and oral comprehensive exam in the three content areas, Linguistics & Methodology, Spanish Literature and Spanish American Literature.

**Action Description:** 

It was decided that the procedures covering the three sec ons of the comprehensive exam would be maintained, as all graduating students were utimately successful on the all parts of the exam.

# **Update to Previous Cycle's Plan for Continuous Improvement**

#### Previous Cycle's Plan For Continuous Improvement (Do Not Modify):

WOLC has for the first time set tangible departmental goals for the MA in Spanish in 2016-2017: 1.Conduct a thorough self-study review of the MA in Spanish to order to better understand how to further develop the existing curriculum. 2.Assess graduating MA students' written and oral production skills according to ACTFL guidelines. 3.Develop additional courses in applied linguistics so that curriculum meets the needs of the majority of students enrolling in the program.

#### Update of Progress to the Previous Cycle's PCI:

Progress updates to PCI are listed below:

1. Conduct a thorough self-study review of the MA in Spanish to order to be er understand how to further develop the exis ng curriculum.

After careful review of thereview report produced by Drs. Villa and Baranowski, we agree with the vast majority of their recommenda ons for developing the Spanish MA program at Sam Houston State University. In looking at the nature of the specific recommenda ons, we have determined that some can be implemented quickly, while others will take more me. Accordingly, we have divided our responses into short-term, middle-term, and long-term goals (see table, below).

2. Assess gradua ng MA students' wri en and oral produc on skills according to ACTFL guidelines.

As a result of the MA review, WOLC was not able to formally assess the MA students' oral and wri en ACTFL skills in Spring 2017. However, this assessment will be given to three gradua ng students in Spring 2018.

3. Develop addi onal courses in applied linguis cs so that curriculum meets the needs of the majority of students enrolling in the program.

Based on reccomenda ons in the MA Review Report, WOLC has started development of three courses targe ng the teaching of oral and wri en skills in the classroom, the role of culture in language learning, and second language acquisi on. The first course (Principles of Second Language

Acquisi on) will be given at the Woodlands Center in Spring 2018.
