

1.06 Should a faculty member receive an administrative FES X assignment (see APS 790601), the faculty member will receive a separate evaluation for the FES X assignment by the supervisor of the assignment as well as the FES 5 evaluation. The weights for FES 1, 2, 3, and 4 are not adjusted and the faculty member receives an FES 5-based merit recommendation as if he/she does not have a separate FES X assignment. In a like manner, the faculty member's performance of the FES X responsibility is evaluated and a merit recommendation is made as if the FES X assignment is the faculty member's sole responsibility. The final merit recommendation is the weighted average of the two merit recommendations.

The weight for FES X is the proportional reduction in the teaching load and the weight for FES 5 is one minus the sum of all FES X weights. If a faculty member had no release time, enter "0" for FES X Total Release Weight and Weighted FES X


