To prepare Sam Houston State University undergraduate students to compete successfully for outstanding graduate and professional programs and equip them to join a globally engaged professional and creative community.


Mission

The SHSU Center for Enhancing Undergraduate Research Experiences and Creative Activities (EURECA) advances the culture of scholarly and creative excellence by cultivating and developing faculty-mentored, discipline-specific inquiry among undergraduate students. The Center also educates undergraduate students about how discipline-specific inquiry enriches the academic experience and helps them realize professional goals.

Phase I (November, 2013): New Initiatives Progress Narrative

An unofficial "office of undergraduate research" was established 1 September 2013. The director, Dr. Tamara J. Cook convened an advisory board comprised of two representatives from each of SHSU's seven colleges, and a representative from each of the following campus programs, the McNair program, Student Success Initiatives, the Elliot T. Bowers Honors College, The Woodlands Center, the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs, and Newton Gresham Library. A list of advisory board members is provided at the end of this document. In the fall semester of 2013 the office of undergraduate research accomplished the following:

- 1. Officially named the center the SHSU Center for Enhancing Undergraduate Research Experiences and Creative Activities (hereafter referred to as the EURECA Center),
- 2. Presented the EURECA Center concept to the Council of Academic Deans and began meeting with individual college leadership teams,
- 3. Defined scholarly and creative activities to include problem based learning in which students learn the analytical and investigative processes of their discipline in an active manner. Thus students become producers, not only consumers, of knowledge. These discipline-specific inquiries are inclusive of all disciplines and are broadly defined to include laboratory, field, applied, archival, creative or traditional classroom research that is conducted and disseminated by an undergraduate student.
- 4. Using this definition, developed vision and mission statements for the EURECA Center,
- 5. Began designing content for a EURECA Center website, and
- Revised and distributed the guidelines for the Summer 2014 Faculty and Student Team (FAST) Awards. The purpose of this program is to encourage the participation of undergraduate students in discipline-specific scholarly or creative work, and
- 7. Developed a proposal and 5-year strategic plan for the EURECA Center.



Process/Effectiveness Obstacles

Although Sam Houston State University has a rich tradition of engaging undergraduates in research, scholarship, and creative activities and incorporates faculty-student collaborative accomplishments, there exists a need to enhance and extend our present initiatives. As the quantity and quality of undergraduate scholarly engagement continues to grow, we can, with faculty and administrative support, organize and sustain this effort to become a recognized leader in undergraduate engagement in discipline-specific scholarly work. A centralized office can be instrumental in increasing students' awareness of the importance and centrality of discipline specific-scholarly work in their educational experience and can advance the culture of scholarly and creative excellence by educating students about how research and creative activities enrich the academic experience and helps them realize professional goals. Establishment of a centralized office for undergraduate research and creative activities also establishes an infrastructure to help students and faculty navigate campus bureaucracy, respond to opportunities, coordinate activities and reduce duplicative efforts among a variety of independent programs.

In meetings with the CAD and various college leadership teams, there has been great enthusiasm for the concept but without seed money to get the EURECA Center up and running it will be difficult to leverage funding from external sources (e.g. grant agencies, foundations and alumni).

Of the many models we found at other institutions funding for fellowships such as the proposed EURECA Center Fellowship for Scholarly or Creative Projects comes from a variety of sources. If EURECA gets a substantial budget increase for YEAR 2 activities, part of that increase will be used to initiate this program. However, we will seek additional funding sources to partially or wholly fund this program in YEAR 2 and to increase the number of awards in subsequent years.
