The Office of Academic Planning and Assessment has funding available for assessment-related activities in the form of competitive Assessment Mini-Grants. These grants are available to all faculty and staff at SHSU to help fund new or ongoing assessment practices within programs, offices, or departments; or to all faculty and staff to help fund travel to make an assessment-related presentation at a professional conference. Eligible recipients may request up to \$1,000.

The deadline for grant applications will be December 1, 2017, with decisions regarding acceptance being made by January 31, 2018. If any funds remain after this period, additional applications will be accepted and reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
